Michigan State Representative Ken Goike was elected in November 2010 to his first term in the Michigan House of Representatives to represent residents of (the 33rd District) Macomb, Ray, Armada, Richmond and Lenox Townships. This bill is an attempt to remedy the increased transportation costs by requiring local units that have banned the land application of septage waste to make available a receiving facility with a service area that encompasses the entire local unit and to ensure that the receiving facility can and will accept all septage waste generated in the local unit.
